

PE ACTION PLAN

Aston Hall Junior and Infant School

From September 2013 the Government has allocated funding directly to the primary school to support and improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – will be allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools. PE and sport are an entitlement of all pupils, integral to the curriculum offered to our children. Sport is taught throughout school; the positive values of sports support and underpin the ethos and values of our school. All children receive a minimum of 2 hours timetabled PE each week with a range of after-school clubs and activities helping to develop this further.

To implement a new assessment scheme in line with the new national curriculum which monitors, tracks and evaluates progression of skills in PE for each year group	On-going plan Now Aston Hall is established in the WPT trust, KH to meet with WPT to discuss assessing PE objectives with the sports coaches and teachers.		
2. Improving the quality of PE lessons delivered across school to ensure pupils needs are met	All pupils have had access to structured physical activities, 2 hours of PE a week and lunch time activities through WPT sport coaches. Children have accessed a wide range of games delivered by the WPT coaches and class teachers working alongside. Access to a range of activities has provided opportunities to develop new interests in sports/PE for the children. All staff have been involved in teaching PE with the sports coaches. Staff have expressed how useful the sports coaches are for their own CPD in delivering PE and sport healthy living activity.	After meeting with the headteacher and class teachers (receiving feedback) Aston Hall will now employs WPT coaches for two days (Tuesday and Thursday) to continue and develop the quality of PE lessons delivered across school as well as CPD for teachers and TAs.	
3. Increased pupil participation in competitive sports and healthy living (in and out of school)	After school clubs have been run by teachers and WPT coaches each term with a 22% increase of children across school attending different clubs. Bike It project increased pupil and family participation as well as healthy living through bike it breakfast events, learn to ride and stabilizer success. Children from FS2, KS1 and KS2 accessed these events. Participation and attendance in sports festivals	Further increase school clubs (after school and lunch time) which is available for all children to access. Organising new events this year has raised Aston Hall's profile - i.e. bike it breakfast, new and improved sports day, more after school and lunch time clubs. A regular PE notice board has been displayed in the school hall to show different information and pictures to children, staff and parents. Gold School Games Mark Award has raised our profile for sports games and festivals.
