Maths


Y5- Maths will be continuing to build our confidence and fluency with arithmetic, particularly focusing on calculations which include fractions, decimals and percentages. In addition, we are covering statistics, looking at solving problems from graphs and timetables, and are also moving onto position and direction, looking at co-ordinates, translation and reflection. In maths we will also be completing some work on a project called Money Matters. We'll be covering many of our maths objectives through this and will develop the children's knowledge of financial literacy.

Y6- Following SATs, Y6 will continue to revise key areas of maths in preparation for secondary school, as well as completing more problems in context-based maths, applying all of our KS2 Maths learning to a range of different real-life situations.

English

For the first part of the term, we will be completing our Hunger Games book and learning linked to this, beginning with a narrative. After this, much of our learning will be linked to Whitby and will be centred around Bram Stoker's

Dracula. We have Dracula related activities planned in during our trip, which includes the opportunity to meet some of our **art** and **drama** objectives during our visit to Whitby Abbey. We will have some fantastic writing opportunities in **English** following exploration of the text as well as other texts linked to Whitby when we return to school.



In history this term, our topic is 20th century migration. We begin the topic by looking at how migration has affected Britain for thousands of years! This unit then encompasses lots of important events within the 20th century including migration from Pakistan from 1947 as well as why people migrated from the Caribbean to Britain from 1948. We will then explore the Windrush Scandal and how migration has changed Britain, shaping it into what it is today. The topic will allow us to make links to our PSHE learning when exploring factors such as discrimination and racism.

Geography

In geography this term our topic is Whitby. We start the topic by making comparisons to our local area, considering both the human and physical geography in each place. We then be learning about erosion: how it is caused, how this affects the people in Whitby and how erosion changes the coastal landscape. During our residential to Whitby, we'll be spending some time to carry out fieldwork linked to tourism.

<u>Art</u>

For our final term, UKS2 will explore 2 more artists. We begin with Frida Kahlo, learning about who she was, her inspiration, what her style of art was as well as

working with oil pastels. We'll finish this unit by creating self-portraits using the oil pastel skills we've developed. Finally, we will be looking at the work of Caroline Appleyard who has used Whitby as inspiration for lots of her artwork! We will be focusing on developing skills using paint during this unit and will produce a final piece inspired by Caroline Appleyard's work.
